The Year of the Consumer

Back in 2019 I was talking to Jack Crawford at Loose Spokes Bike Shop in Grand Haven about ordering a custom made bike from Colnago. At that time, he mentioned to me how bike sales are cyclical - some years are good, others can be not so good. Having many decades of experience running his shop, he cited many boom and bust cycles he endured. Social dynamics have a lot to do with the desire to ride, such as a new fad, a new exercise, explore, the economy—you name it. Little did Jack know how accurate he was about the immediate future.

Like any industry, prognosticating about the future prospects of business is more akin a shot in the dark than actual calculation. More often than not, the pundits get it wrong.

Enter the typical small bike shop, working on thin margins, variable payroll demands, and stock that must be ordered almost 6 to 8 months ahead of time. The shop owner takes a risk every year on what to order and what services to provide. Most times they get it about right, but not always.

With the pandemic in 2020, they were caught completely off guard with the huge demand and sold out everything in the store by early Summer. Repairs went through the roof, as at least a repaired older bike was better than no bike.

However, banking on 2021, 2022, and 2023, most shops overstocked inventory and brought on new e-bikes. By all reports, many 2022 and 2023 models are still in the shops with reduced demand.

WELL, consumer, this is your chance!! Look at any shop now and you'll find many excellent rides in stock at greater discounts than last year.

If you're in the market, consumer, NOW is your time!!



Addendum Ride



ABOVE—So 2 weeks after Colorburst, I had some time to actually ride one of the three routes I had created. The weather was very nice, dry and almost 55 degrees. The peak colors are now about 1 week past, but still better than 2 weeks prior. The three routes are a 50K recreational road route to Fallasburg Park and back to Chief Hazy Cloud Park, a 100K Road route to Greenville, and a 100K mixed surface "Adventure" route. I'm on the Adventure route here on the Fred Meijer trail north of Belding. By using the trail and gravel roads the car traffic was sparse and scenery just beautiful. My 33mm gravel tires did a great job.



RIGHT— The night before my ride, I realized that the <u>Lowell Classic gravel race</u> was the same day I was riding. In checking the routes, sure enough there was a chance I'd run into them. As I approached Montcalm Avenue south of Fallasburg, I saw riders coming south on Montcalm. My route went north on the same gravel road. This road is quite steep, so I found a great place to watch riders as they struggled to survive the climb.

I ran into several groups on that road (54, 38, and 15 mile), myself riding in the wrong direction! I got out of the way in the nearest ditch I could find.

Addendum Ride



ABOVE— Some riders had the experience and gearing to just spin their way up the hill, like our rider at the front. Others though are not experienced and struggled, especially more as the waves of riders went by me. Our rider on the far right just remounted the bike after some period of walking.

On 33mm gravel tires, the Fred Meijer Trail was great. Mostly recycled asphalt, not too loose nor bumpy. This is somewhere between Belding and Greenville.

The variety of land on the trail is quite varied. This is an old marsh filled in with grassland now.




ABOVE — The reward for the candy bar was this beautiful maple tree on the Flat River at the same park.


